We also extend a warm welcome to **Mr Isral Bustami** in **Indonesia** who has agreed to act as IMEB agent in that country and who is currently organizing Music exams in Jakarta in November 2011. We look forward to working with the teachers in the Concilio Music Conservatorium, and establishing a successful relationship there.

We also welcome **Kathy Chan** as IMEB representative in **Hong Kong** who replaces Ms Fiona Ng following her recent marriage. Kathy is a graduate of AICM and completed her IMEB Music Performance Diploma when she was a student in Sydney, so she is very familiar with the way IMEB operates. Kathy is actively trying to introduce an IMEB presence in Hong Kong where other exam systems have long been firmly established.



The IMEB **website** continues to attract steady attention and flow of enquiries. We try to keep the **website** updated each time there is any significant news to announce, and trust teachers check up on **Latest** Anouncements and Updates. These recently include:

- a) Reminding <u>country/interstate teachers</u> that a levy may be imposed by them to cover the costs of examiner travel, meals and accommodation.
- b) The <u>updated 'Keyboard' syllabus</u> is now available for download.
- c) The Classical Piano Syllabus early grades previously styled <u>STANDARD 1, 2, 3</u> are now styled PRE-GRADE 1, 2, 3
- d) <u>All IMEB exams</u>, in **all** subjects, which have a time-limit of <u>10 or 15 minutes</u>, should each be <u>extended by 5 minutes</u> when teachers plan exam timetables. This is to allow examiners sufficient time to settle the candidates into the exam session and to encourage them to feel comfortable rather than risk feeling stressed and rushed through these short early grade exams. Examiners also feel that the extra five minutes will assist in writing reports, checking name spellings with candidates, recording marks, and completing master sheet details etc within the allocated timeslot. Additional work/items are <u>NOT</u> required to take up the extra time.

In general the perennial difficulty of **mis-spelt names** has improved. However there have still been some problems and in one case the teacher pointed out that 'it was only one letter in the name that was wrong' (eg Ellinor for Elinor.) Irrespective of how many letters are recorded incorrectly, a new certificate still has to be produced and redelivered. In another case the teacher had forgotten how to spell a name and assumed the IMEB office would have a record of the candidate's name from a previous year's exam list and we would look it up to see how it was spelt. We are not making this up! Again, we ask teachers to continue to be vigilant and consistent in recording the names on the Entry forms and all paper work relating to candidates and their exams. If in doubt, always check with the parents rather than hazard a reasonable guess at spellings. There are some extraordinary spelling variations these days as you know, and parents are usually the first to complain that a certificate has the incorrect spelling. Thank you again.

Music of Stage and Screen : This new Syllabus has been well received and some fine work was presented during the year. Congratulations to the teachers and candidates who have embraced it with enthusiasm. We feel it has a bright future and look forward to further presentations of items from Opera, Operetta, Gilbert & Sullivan, Light Opera, Early Musicals, Broadway and West End Shows, Musical Comedy, Rock and Concept Musicals, Disney and Film Musicals etc

Expansion: We are still pleased to receive enquiries from new contacts in New Zealand and S.E. Asian countries as well as other Australian states. If teachers can continue to help us in our expansion process through your contacts and networks in these areas, we would be delighted to hear from you.

The exam fees schedule remains the same for 2011 and is printed on the reverse of the New Examination Entry Form which is available for download from the website. Teachers who do not use a computer should continue to photocopy the New Examination Entry Form which was mailed last year and is attached with this Newsletter. Please do NOT use the old/out-of-date Entry form.

Included on the form are the **Closing Dates** for both Series which **will apply annually until further notice.**

Series 1 : Theory and Practical : 1 May annually

Series 2 : Theory : 1 August annually Practical : 1 October annually

Teachers, please try to observe these **Closing Dates** carefully. There is great difficulty in trying to schedule last-minute exam entries after the cut-off dates.

We feel this is preferable to changing the dates each year and series, based as they have been in the past on school terms and holidays etc. Teachers should copy this attached **Examination Entry Form** as often as required to submit candidates' names for exams.

No exams will be conducted after 30 Nov annually.

Series 1 Theory Exams : <u>9am, Friday, 20 May 2011</u> The venue for Sydney candidates will be at <u>AICM, 31-33 Allen Street, Harris Park</u>. Country candidates will need to sit the Theory Exam at a suitable venue, with a supervisor, arranged by the teacher. Please advise IMEB as early as possible, supervisor's name and address for mailing of the exam papers.

Series 1 Practical Exams : may be arranged with the IMEB by teachers. Once again may we ask you to avoid requesting specific dates for the Practical Exams. Instead, please give us an indication of preferred weeks or time frame, as early as possible, and we will do our best to accommodate you as usual.

NB. Requests for both Theory and Practical exams to be taken <u>outside</u> the designated time/date can <u>not</u> be considered in future. The possible and very serious ramifications of Theory exam information/questions being widely disseminated can not be discounted, and the problems in arranging extra venues and supervisors makes these requests very difficult.

GRADUATION Date for 2011: The Graduation will take place at <u>2pm on Saturday, 21 May 2011</u> in the Main Hall at the AICM Campus, at 114 Victoria Road, Rozelle. There will be more than <u>50 Graduating Diploma candidates</u> who will receive information about requirements for the ceremony in due course. **ADVANCE ADVICE**: We would draw your attention to advice printed in previous Newsletters about annual Graduation requirements and the responsibilities for graduates to acquire their own mortar board and gown. There seems to be a perception that IMEB will simply have everything 'on tap' for graduates at the venue. Further information will be mailed to graduates before the 21 May ceremony. With nearly 4 months' notice there should be plenty of time for Graduates to locate and organize the hire of their cap and gown.

Teachers please remind your graduating Diplomates not to leave these arrangements to the last minute, but start planning NOW with the booking, hiring or borrowing of caps and gowns.

Important Reminder;

1. Memorisation: Items which are set for 'memory' are expected to be memorised and not 'bead'.

2. Palmcards: There are still a number of studios who are still permittifg candidates to read palmcards as if reading a passage of prose. Please try to encourage students to use palmcards properly. ie: as cues only, rather than writing and reading the whole item as, apart from incorrect use, the reading process detracts from an effective communication delivery. Believe it or not, but a number of candidates are still reading both talks and speeches. This is not acceptable. The opportunity to show skill in effective 'prose reading' is provided in various sections through the Syllabus grades and levels.

Theatre Performance for the Individual: You will be interested to know that several teachers are continuing to enter candidates for this innovative Syllabus. They report how suitable, exciting and motivating it is for those students who are multitalented in S/D, Music, Movement, Visual Arts and who love all aspects of '*Theatre*'. It is good to hear that the teachers realize they do not have to be multi-talented themselves to teach this syllabus. The students virtually design their own workload to prepare for the exams and thoroughly enjoy the challenge and ownership of their program content.

We are sure that if you take a moment to analyse the Syllabus closely, you will find that it contains wonderfully sequential opportunities through Grades up to Diploma level for students who are developing in these related arts and who enjoy all aspects of performance studies.

Please consider implementing this enjoyable and varied syllabus in your studio for your talented students.

In response to various requests, we are again attaching:

1. The current **Examination Entry Form** is attached to this Newsletter. Please copy it as many times as you require. <u>This new form must be used in future and replaces the 'old' form</u>. UPPER CASE LETTERS is recommended for candidates' names, as per the example. Cf. back page for current fees schedule.

2. Sample **solo dramatic character monologue.** There are still some candidates/teachers who admit to having difficulty condensing a page of dialogue to form a solo piece. Close analysis of the monologue on the right side of the page will reveal that the other character's utterances have been absorbed into it. Teachers will realize that punctuation marks, and pauses between statements in the monologue would allow the candidate/actor to show reaction and interaction, facially and physically, to the 'presence' of the other character. This excerpt is from the musical vaudeville 'Chicago' (text Fred Ebb) and is the interchange between Roxie the murderess and Billy Flynn her lawyer, prior to her trial.

3. Appendix of selected **dramatists and plays** which contain monologues or passages suitable for arranging into solo performances. **This list is NOT prescriptive**.

SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENT Associate Diploma in Studio Teaching AIMEB(ST)

It has been brought to our attention that there are a number of experienced teachers, who for various reasons, have been unable to complete a Teaching Diploma and who now feel they are not sufficiently 'in practice' to perform their pieces at a high standard. IMEB is therefore offering an **Associate Diploma in Studio Teaching AIMEB(ST)** in all Music, Speech and Drama subjects. This exam will consist of a presentation of two (2) *lessons (one Junior level up to Gr 4, and one Senior level from Gr 5 to Gr 8)* accompanied by a written teaching lesson plan for each lesson. Aims/Objectives and detailed sequential content should be clearly stated. Maximum total time of the exam for the two lessons, is 40-45 minutes and the entry fee is \$175. Entries may be submitted at any time.
